President's Report (John Hibbard/Kerry Lowary)

- Ray made a motion to accept the November minutes. Seconded by Leslie, no debate, motion carried.
- Ray made a motion to accept the December minutes. Seconded by Leslie, no debate, motion carried.
- The new shelter construction is nearing completion, no safety issues.
- Tentative time to move in is the last half of April. Everythings currently on schedule for that.
- Working on the epoxy floors now, cannot enter the building until they're fully cured. Doors/windows are in, no hardware. Paint is up. Lights and heat are on.
- City contract meeting last Monday, set to renegotiate in May. The goal is to make the city and county contracts the same. Three year contract instead of one year.

Shelter Manager Report (Kerry Lowary)

- Current census is 92 animals. 14 dogs from December court case. YTD stats: Live Release 94%, 96% for cats, 91% dogs.
- Finishing grant application for Kentucky Colonels.
- CPR and AED training for the staff, working with Jody to organize that.
- 133 SPN this month so far, not including TNR.

Program Coordinator Report (Jody Spaulding)

- Report included as part of the record.
- 6 new volunteers.
- First meeting held for celebrity waiters dinner, date set for June 2nd-6th.
- Bourbon promotion visited over 300 businesses.
- Altec Arena table this Saturday the 28th, volunteers needed.
- Table at Frankfort ComiCon the 28th, from 9 to 5.
- Good Shepherd School on the 30th to talk about FCHS and our programs.
- Cares Coalition talk at the library on the 31st.

NLOL Report (Terri Smith)

- No report included as part of the record.
- Numbers up from November because of the holidays.
- Angel tree customers + donations (\$1818). \$973 sponsored 40 cats/dogs, 140 TNR calendars
- Consumer protection agency came to check for child safety. Not an investigation, but just a check. Gave guidelines to make things safe for customers.
- Donations slowed down due to cold weather.

Treasurer's Report (Cheryl Broyles)

- No report included as part of the record.
- September: total assets \$5,996,514.64. +\$537,330. YTD \$633,000. Accounts Receivable: the final payment (\$400,000) from the county did come in.
- Audrey's working on the W2G form for the bourbon raffle winners. They have to sign a W9 which we use to file the W2G.
- Talking about moving bank accounts after changing to the new shelter.
- Can close the Community Trust account from the PPE loans (\$1500).
- Going to work with Kerry to set up the POS system for the new shelter.

• Building account at \$855,372, reserve account at \$145,970, Mark Mitchell account at \$270,196.

Capital Campaign (John Hibbard/Bill Klier)

- 934 tickets sold so far. \$93,498 (includes donations). Raffle drawing Thursday February 9th at Bourbon on Main. Half of the upstairs room is reserved. Needs to be advertised to the membership.
- \$8000 for antique collection, \$15000 in advertising.
- Monday (30th) WKYT interview, Bill interview Wednesday (1st).
- Wesbanco said that Stewart Home should donate to us, in response to State Journal letter. Application has been submitted.
- Frankfort Toyota is donating a 2023 KIA to raffle (\$30,000 car). Maybe \$20 a ticket? End of February start: Opening of mid-may to cushion for new shelter? Brainstorm to figure out time frame, perhaps summer drawing. Will form a committee.

TNR Report (Gae Broadwater)

- March madness for TNR cats, typically gets \$3000.

New Business

- Police dropping animals off without notification– especially bad in the winter. City is severely lacking in their care and cooperation. Been looking at expenses/fees, as well as drop off times and notifications. If it happens again, we will change the locks and have them call to gain access. In May with the new contract/facility there will be a new indoor port that they can access.
- Employee retention credits on back taxes, checking if the shelter qualifies. Looking at getting the staff a health savings account.
